

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What does the Bible says about itself?

All scripture is inspired by God

- 2 Timothy 3:16
- All scripture is inspired by God and is[a] useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,

Inspired by the Holy Spirit

- 2 Peter 1:20-21
- 20 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

God inspired, human writer

The Law of Moses – came from God

- Exodus 17:14
- 14 Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Write this on a scroll as something to be remembered and make sure that Joshua hears it, because I will completely blot out the name of Amalek from under heaven.'

- 27 Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Write down these words, for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel.'

The autograph kept carefully.

Prophet and scribe recorded God's words

Jeremiah 36: 1-7

In the fourth year of Jehoiakim son of Josiah king of Judah, this word came to Jeremiah from the Lord: 2 'Take a scroll and write on it all the words I have spoken to you concerning Israel, Judah and all the other nations from the time I began speaking to you in the reign of Josiah till now. 3 Perhaps when the people of Judah hear about every disaster I plan to inflict on them, they will each turn from their wicked ways; then I will forgive their wickedness and their sin.' 4 So Jeremiah called Baruch son of Neriah, and while Jeremiah dictated all the words the Lord had spoken to him, Baruch wrote them on the scroll. 5 Then Jeremiah told Baruch, 'I am restricted; I am not allowed to go to the Lord's temple. 6 So you go to the house of the Lord on a day of fasting and read to the people from the scroll the words of the Lord that you wrote as I dictated. Read them to all the people of Judah who come in from their towns. 7 Perhaps they will bring their petition before the Lord and will each turn from their wicked ways, for the anger and wrath pronounced against this people by the Lord are great.'



Bible transmission in ancient times



Joshua copied the law...continual transmission

- Joshua 8:31-32
- 31 as Moses the servant of the Lord had commanded the Israelites. He built it according to what is written in the Book of the Law of Moses – an altar of uncut stones, on which no iron tool had been used. On it they offered to the Lord burnt offerings and sacrificed fellowship offerings. 32 There, in the presence of the Israelites, Joshua wrote on stones a copy of the law of Moses.

The King is to make a copy

- Deuteronomy 17:18
- 18 When he takes the throne of his kingdom, he is to write for himself on a scroll a copy of this law, taken from that of the Levitical priests.

Devoted scribe taught the law faithfully...

- Ezra 7:9-11
- 9 He had begun his journey from Babylon on the first day of the first month, and he arrived in Jerusalem on the first day of the fifth month, for the gracious hand of his God was on him. 10 For Ezra had devoted himself to the study and observance of the Law of the Lord, and to teaching its decrees and laws in Israel.

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



Bible transmission in ancient times




First printed Bible - Printed by Johannes Gutenberg, in Mainz, Germany, in the 1450s.



Codex Sinaiticus ca. 320-360 AD (Greek Bible)




Codex Vaticanus AD 4th Century (Greek Bible)




Codex Alexandrinus (5th Century) (Septuagint and NT)






Aleppo Codex c. 920 AD (Hebrew Bible - Masoretic Text)







Dead Sea Scroll discovery 1946-7










Jesus Read the Scroll

Luke 4

17 The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. 10 Rules of the Scribe

- 1. Ritual cleansing/bathing before writing God's name
- 2. They must say each word aloud while they were writing.
- 3. No copying from memory, must have a manuscript
- 4. Scrolls must have equal amounts of columns
- 5. Letters, words, paragraphs and columns are counted
- 6. Parchment/Papyrus must be lined before starting
- 7. Each column must extend downwards 48 to 60 lines
- 8. Must be reviewed with in 30 days of copying.
- 9. Old/errant copies of Scripture are ritually destroyed
- 10. Being aware of the conscious presence of God

Reliability: Copy Accuracy

Before discovering the Dead Sea Scrolls, scholars translated the English Old Testament from Hebrew manuscripts (Masoretic Text) that dated from 900 AD (Aleppo Codex) and later, 1300 years from the end of the Old Testament (400 BC). How accurate was the copying process during the 1300 year interval?

Dead Sea Scrolls



Closed interval by 1000+ years

95% identical to Masoretic Text

Aleppo Codex Masoretic Text

125 BC

 5% difference is due to spelling differences, word order and minor scribal error which effects no major doctrine


How accurate was the transmission?





Jezebel Seal



While excavating in Samaria, Israel, the Oriental Institute of Chicago unearthed building structures and temples built to Asherah and Baal, which was commonly associated with Jezebel (1 Kings 18:19). Among these finds was an ornate seal which reads "JZBL" (Jezebel).

This seal appears to be consistent with 1 Kings 21:6-8 which reveals that Jezebel, wife of Ahab, was accustom to sealing documents for her husband (1 Kings 21:25).

Archaeology confirms Biblical reliability

Fulfilment of prophecy (ca 529 BC)

• 2 Chronicles 36:21-23

- 21 The land enjoyed its sabbath rests; all the time of its desolation it rested, until the seventy years were completed in fulfilment of the word of the Lord spoken by Jeremiah.
- 22 In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, in order to fulfil the word of the Lord spoken by Jeremiah, the Lord moved the heart of Cyrus king of Persia to make a proclamation throughout his realm and also to put it in writing:
- 23 'This is what Cyrus king of Persia says: "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and he has appointed me to build a temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. Any of his people among you may go up, and may the Lord their God be with them."

Cyrus the Great

Below is the 6th century BC tomb at Pasargadae (Iran) of the biblical figure "Cyrus" prophesied by Isaiah (45:1) 150 years before his birth. He would eventually bring liberation to the Jewish captives in Babylon before his death in 529 BC. According to 1st century BC Greek historian, Strabo, Alexander the Great visited the tomb before his death. The tomb inscription reads:



"Oh man, I am Cyrus, who founded the empire of the Persians and was king of Asia. Grudge me not therefore this monument."

Cyrus Cylinder

Persian clay cylinder (6th century BC) written in Babylonian cuneiform describes King Cyrus's victory over Babylon and his permission of free worship. The cylinder declares that:

- Cyrus allowed the return of foreign gods to their own land
- The rebuilding of destroyed cities and religious buildings (2 Chronicles 36:22-23; Isaiah 45:1-13; Ezra 1:1-3; 6:1-5)
- The cylinder is considered the "first charter of human rights."
 "I returned to sacred cities on the other side of the Tigris, the sanctuaries of which have been in ruins for a long time, the images which to live therein and established for...



Jesus' Prophecy

- "Jesus left the temple and was walking away when his disciples came up to him to call his attention to its buildings. "Do you see all these things?" he asked. "I tell you the truth, not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down" (Matt.24:1-8 NIV).



He was Staff Member Emeritus with the Carnegie Observatories in Pasadena, California.[2] He is best known for determining the first reasonably accurate value for the Hubble constant and the age of the universe. He is also the discoverer of the first quasar. He was one of the most influential astronomer of the 20th century



Isaac Newton:

 This most beautiful system of the sun, planets, and comets, could only proceed from the counsel and dominion of an intelligent Being.  - Evil deeds of the kings.




Jesus Primarily Used a Translation

- Jesus Primarily Used a Translation
- Jesus and the Apostles: studied, memorized, used, quoted, and read most often from the Bible of their day, the Septuagint.
- Since Matthew wrote primarily to convince the Jews that Jesus of Nazareth was indeed their promised Messiah, it follows as a matter of course that his Gospel is saturated with the Hebrew Scriptures. Yet, when Jesus quotes the Old Testament in Matthew, He uses the Hebrew text only 10% of the time, but the Greek LXX translation—90% of the time!
- Amazingly, Jesus and Paul used the LXX as their primary Bible.


The New Testament quoted from a translation (the Septuagint)

- Of the places where the New Testament quotes the Old, the great majority is from the Septuagint version.
- Authors Archer and Chirichigno list 340 places where the New Testament cites the Septuagint but only 33 places where it cites from the Masoretic Text rather than the Septuagint
- (G. Archer and G. C. Chirichigno, Old Testament Quotations in the New Testament: A Complete Survey, 25-32).

Inductive & Deductive Reasoning.. For a reason-base faith


- The Bible (the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments) is the Word of God.








When science contradicts the scripture
